SOCIAL DISTANCING OPTIONS FOR HIGH TRAFFIC BUSINESSES

Social Distancing is proven to slow the spread of viruses in a community. Not everyone can work remotely, and some business need to remain open and serve the public. In such circumstances, here are some options on decreasing person-to-person contact.

- Seek to adjust hours of operation/shifts which may allow less staff to be on site at any given time.
- Place separating markers (lines) on the floor for social distancing to be practiced.
- Limit the number of persons entering at a given time.
- Increase the sanitation measures (frequency and extent of which the cleanings are being done) and provide sanitizing supplies.
- Assess the customer traffic patterns at the locations and the various staffing needs for each branch.
- Allow Non-customer-facing employees to work from home.
- Encourage online/telephone/drive-thru business to customers where practical.
- Allocate special hours for vulnerable persons: e.g elderly and disabled.
- Limit persons who are not doing business.
- Serve customers behind a Perspex window.
- Have customers set appointments to do business.
